Here's what I used for this shirt (really you can use just about anything for the stencil): - Sharp hobby knife - Sheets of cardboard (flattened cardboard toxes work well) - Spray bottle (got mine from the Dollar Store, though they charged \$1.67, what a crock!) - Bleach (again Dollar Dollar, but was more. Seriously guys, change your name) - A fun shape (any object will work so long as its silhouette is easily recognizable) - Plain t-shirts Mix the bleach and water 50/50, you're going to need a bit so I'd recommend a minimum of 250ml (1 cup) of each. Now is a good time to wash your shirts to get the shrinking out of the way. Thanks to the web, designers are now able to print and sell their designs to a wider audience.
